A RATIONALE....

The process of changing the translations of the Roman Missal is something that is ever ongoing. We are preparing to welcome the "Third Edition" of the English Version of the Roman Missal. The first was issued right after Vatican II in the mid 1960's. The Second edition was promulgated in 1973 and since 2000 work has been done by a panel of bishops and other representatives of every English Language speaking country in the world. You might think of Great Britain, Ireland, Wales, Australia, but add to this India, the Philippines and other smaller countries that has many different tribal languages and local dialects, they all celebrate the liturgy in English, which has become truly a universal language. So when you hear the words of the prayers that the priest prayers they might sound slightly different. We have to remember that the input of so many different English-speaking countries of the world went into arriving at this new translation. The group that met is referred to as ICEL (I Cel) it stands for the - International Committee for the English Language. Our own Bishop Serratelli was the United States representative for the final years of this project. The priests of the diocese have been through several workshops and we have conducted some in our parish for the liturgical ministers.

The other rationale is that the texts are trying to be truer to the Latin text, which the church used for centuries. An example of this will be our profession of faith of the Creed. Today we say, "We believe" throughout the creed. Beginning on the first Sunday of Advent Nov. 26/27 we will now say throughout "I believe". This change is brought about because the original Latin word is "Credo" and it is a singular, which means, "I believe". Thus trying to stay faithful to the original Latin text brings about this change.

Incorporated into the front of the missal is a document entitled The General Instruction on the Roman Missal. This document is very important because it teaches us how each liturgical minister is to fulfill their role. This document also gives us an opportunity to fine tune the way we celebrate. Each parish is asked to adapt this to their particular church set up and needs, but faithfulness to the document is most important. You will see some slight changes in the role of our ministers too.

Our music ministers are holding a session to go over some of the new response please check the bulletin for details.

ST. MARK'S PARISH LIBRARY...DEACON RAY

If you want to sign out something in the library, note that DVDs, CDs, and magazines are ordinarily kept for a week, books for two weeks, and both are renewed for the same period. Pamphlets are free but cost money so you might consider either taking only one or putting a donation in an envelope and giving it to the parish office so we can order more. The library runs on an honor system so fines are not charged, but everyone is asked to be responsible for returning materials on time so that others may use them. When you first borrow I'll ask for your name, telephone, and email address so we know where to contact you. Teachers using books as part of their lesson preparation or students doing book reports are welcome to longer checkout periods. Since this is a small library materials are arranged in either the books, or media section by author's last name with a subject word listed below the last name. There is a bin for sign-out cards, returned materials, and book request forms. If you see something you'd like for your home or don't see what you'd like you are welcome to fill out an order form and you can pay when it comes in or we'll let you know when your order comes in. If you are not sure what you want look in the Catholic publisher's box in the library. There are a few reference books, but we'll aim to track the books that circulate most and focus on stocking those materials. Your feedback will help us "learn as we go".Deacon Ray
